

Dear SDSU Community,

We are elated to share that last week's Immigration and Customs Enforcement-issued policy, which would have restricted the ability of certain international students to study in the United states, was rescinded today by the Trump administration. We are pleased with this outcome.

As members of a global community, we strongly support our international students, as well as faculty and staff born and raised around the globe. Today's decision comes after nationwide criticism and planned litigation, including a lawsuit the California State University system jointly filed, opposing the updated guidelines. Such a policy was unrealistic and problematic, and would have significantly hampered the teaching and research missions of public higher education across the nation, including our own.

Next Steps for Our International Students

Earlier, we asked all of our international students to respond to a survey so that we could quickly assess how best to support them.

If you are a continuing student you no longer need to complete the survey. With the policy rescinded, our expectation is that we will be able to welcome you back to classes according to our SDSU Flex plan guidelines.

If you are a new incoming freshmen or transfer student, please complete the survey as soon as possible, if you have not done so already. SDSU Global Affairs will continue to work closely with all incoming international students to meet their educational planning needs for Fall 2020.
